



# Claymore Rally

## SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

### 1. Event

Highland Car Club Ltd ("HCC") will promote a Clubsport (12 car) status Navigational Rally on **Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2010**. The event will start from Bitz Motorsport, Balmakeith Ind Estate, Nairn, Map Reference – 27/89405630. There will be a total mileage of 47.5 miles on public and private roads. The finish venue will be at Covenanters Inn, Alldearn, Map Reference – 27/91755545, (which is not the location of the final control).

### 2. Jurisdiction

The event will be held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association Ltd ("MSA")(incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, and any written instructions that HCC may issue for the event.

### 3. Authorisation

The event complies with the requirements of The Motor Vehicles (Competitions and Trials) (Scotland) Regulations 1976. MSA Permit Number has been applied for. RSAC Authorisation Number has been applied for.

### 4. Eligibility

This event is open to fully elected members of HCC. Club membership cards will be inspected at signing-on.

### 5. Championships

The event will be a counter in the following championships:-

- HCC Training Rally Championship.
- HCC Experienced Rally Championship.
- HCC Open Rally Championship
- HCC Historic Rally Championship.
- Ian C. Smith Club Championship.

### 6. Programme

### 9. Classes

Entries for the event will be divided into the following classes:-

Open - for which any crew may enter

Experienced - any crew of which neither member has won the Experienced (or equivalent) or higher class more than six times whilst competing as a navigator on a MSA recognised navigational rally during the period from 1 October 2003 to 1 October 2009.

Novice - any crew of which neither member has won the Novice (or equivalent) or higher class more than three times whilst competing as a navigator on navigational rallies during the period from 1 October 2003 to 1 October 2009.

Historic - any crew may enter. A class award will only be presented if 4 or more crews enter. This class is not eligible for points in any of the Club's championships.

The maximum entry for the event 12. The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes or cancel the event as necessary if the minimum numbers are not reached.

Entries will be selected from the first 12 correctly completed entry forms received and will be seeded in the following order :- Open.....Experienced.....Novice.....Historic.

### 10. Maps and route instructions

Ordnance Survey Landranger (1:50,000) Map number 27 Edition C1

is required. Any feature of the map, legend or cardboard cover may be used to define the route to be taken. Competitors will be supplied with a time card and route card or route instructions as necessary during the event. These documents will provide all the

information necessary for competitors to comply with H25. The correct route will be deemed to be the shortest route which complies with the instructions, and straight-on unless otherwise instructed. All mileages are deemed to be correct.

#### 11. Timing

Cars will start at **TWO** minute intervals. Timing will be Scheduled timing by marshals' watches. A clock showing rally time will be on display at signing on.

H58 No penalty will be imposed for stopping within sight of any control.

H76 competitors may ask for a time later than the time at which the Time Card is presented.

H80 competitors can reduce lateness without penalty in accordance with H82.

#### 12. Technical regulations

All vehicles must comply with the MSA technical regulations H15, 102-129, 262-312 and section C(b).

Competitors should in particular note the following:-

H23 competitors will be identified by numbers which will be provided by the organisers. The competition number must be displayed in the window behind the Navigator's door throughout the event.

H125 induction air/filter elements must be fitted to ensure the vehicle complies with noise regulations.

H110 maximum of four forward facing beams (in addition to side and indicator lights).

H114 vehicles must be currently registered and taxed as a private car.

H115 vehicles must not have any advertising except for event sponsor decals.

C(b)f a commercial type van/pick-up may be used.

#### 13. General Regulations

The General Regulations of the MSA apply except as modified below:-

H92 a Novice is defined as per paragraph 9 of these regulations.

H22 only the competitor named on the entry form as the driver may drive during the event.

H36(a) competitors may carry mobile telephones in their vehicle for emergency use only.

in Quiet Zones (marked by 'Q' boards) competitors must comply with the special restrictions referred to in the Final Instructions. The penalty for failing to comply is exclusion.

The penalty for approaching a control from the wrong direction or for visiting a control more than once is 15 minutes (Chart 84 (c)).

H58 controls and checks will open 15 minutes before the scheduled time of arrival of the first car and will close 30 minutes after the scheduled time of arrival of the last car. The closing time may be extended by the organisers if necessary in accordance with H79.

H86 the Final Instructions may specify certain Time Controls in addition to the final control to which competitors must report to be classified as a finisher.

H90 in the event of a tie, the competitor who has completed the greater

portion of the event from the start with the lesser penalty will be the winner, failing which a timed navigational test will be used.

#### 14. Penalties

Marking and penalties will be in accordance with H Appendix 1 Chart 84 ("Time") except as modified below:-

Chart not reporting at a Passage Control or providing

84 (d) proof of visiting a Route Check (e.g. a Code Board)

- 15 minutes.

#### 15. Results and awards

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after completion of the event.

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with C(d) 45.

The following awards for this event will be presented at Highland Car Club's annual presentation of awards:-

1<sup>st</sup> Open - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator

1<sup>st</sup> Experienced - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator

1<sup>st</sup> Novice - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator

The overall winners will be the highest placed crew in the Open class. No competitor may win more than one award.

#### 16. Insurance

The entrant is required to supply the name and address of his/her competition insurer on the entry form. If you do not have competition insurance you may compete under the following scheme:

The club have applied to Lockton for a blanket Cover Note under the Motor Sport Scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party cover necessary to meet the RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

The basic rate for the Event (before any loadings) will be £16.00.

New applicants wishing to use the Scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Alexander Forbes Declaration:

- Over 21 and held a full licence for at least 6 months;
- Not more than 1 fault accident in last 3 years;
- No more than maximum of 6 speeding points on licence;
- No physical or mental disabilities;
- No other material facts.

If able to comply with all the points above simply sign on Signing On Form for Insurance

No letter of acceptance will be issued.

If unable to comply with any of the above points complete the Declaration Form itself and forward to Club prior to the event to allow sufficient time for a letter of acceptance to be issued. Faxed copies are acceptable.
