



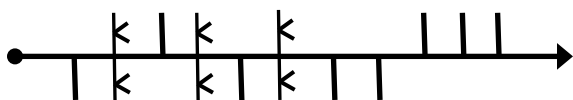

TC42 to TC43

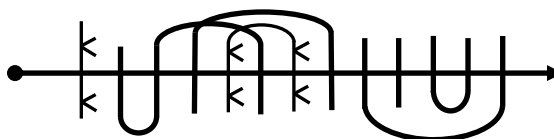
Novice

Similar looking instructions to start off both classes here, though the Novices get a traditional herringbone (therefore junction based) and the Experts get some spaghetti (and therefore grid line based). And both have added ETL's for flavour!

The best approach for the Novices is (at least initially) to treat the ETL's as an unnecessary distraction, and to use them only for confirmation or reassurance that you are on the correct route. Do that and you have a simple CRO herringbone which works without difficulty.

The Experts have a bit more investigation to do to get started as none of the grid line spaghetti strings is numbered, and there are ETL options after a right turn at the first junction. But it is only straight on at the first junction which gets you to an ETL before crossing a grid line. And then you are looking for a route which starts by crossing one gridline twice in succession. That means taking a right at the next junction.

That gives you 65 as the first (and second) gridline, and you can then also number the sixth crossing on the route line.

The ETL's are falling into place as confirmation that you are on the correct route, and gridline 30 is identified for crossings 4 and 8. That takes you on to the road past Manor Farm, which means that the ninth crossing is GL 31.

So GL31 is also the 13th and final crossing on this section, with 3 more GL's in between, one of which you cross twice in succession.

There is only one option which matches this combination (64, then 63 twice) and that takes you to the control shortly after the final GL31.
