Explanation

Another section where both classes are given the same information but in different formats.

The Novices get two lists of map features (and some MR's), one list to avoid and the other to pass. If the avoid instruction is missed or overlooked, a route which includes all of the points can be constructed until MR 219431 which cannot be included without conflict, and should send you back to read the instruction again.

Organisers can complicate instructions like this by mixing up the lists, despite the list headings, so that there are some underlined elements in the Pass list and vice versa. But not here!

The Experts have the same information but in a single list, with the avoids indicated by underlining in the numbering of the elements i.e. avoid elements 1, 2, 6, 7 and 8.

Just like for the Novices, if the underlining is not spotted, the instruction works on the basis of passing all elements until the conflict between MR 219431 and SH173.

Note that the "PC" has a line confirming the building it relates to, and that that building sits on the road edge and therefore would be a "pass" according to the regulations. The PC has to be avoided, hence the loop via the brown road. The picnic site symbol has an arrow only to the edge line of the white layby, so the route loops through there too.

Really devious organisers have been known to identify the avoids by disguising the numbered avoid elements as an additional GS or MR. Not here though!
