

So Novices are looking for four **e**'s to pass through, and then the **on**, all in the directions and order shown. And also remembering (per the Regs 3.5) that you have to avoid any other letters on the road.

The first **e** is in Brookvale, heading south. The second (heading NNE) is in Ballinderry, closely followed by the **e** in Bridge, heading WNW. The final **e** is more difficult to find, and looking back from the target control to find the **on** doesn't offer any help. But it is the **e** in Grove (and heading SE) that you are looking for. It is not obviously 'on' the road but it does break the road edge line which is enough (per the Regs 4.2).

It is an unusual looking instruction for the Experts. Is there any significance in the word "one"?

What are those numbered arrows? Maybe even sufficiently unusual to distract from the instruction that it is TC54 **from** TC55, and therefore backwards.

After perhaps a few false starts you should work out that the arrows are the directions of departure after crossing letters on the road, and that four of those letters happen be **e**'s.

The absence of the target TC location adds to the difficulty but you can pin it down by finding the **on** as long as you have also spotted that the instruction is reversed.

And if you have done that you have good idea where to look for the **e**'s.
